

MAOS First Quarter Newsletter - September 2022

Dear MAOS Families and Community Members,

As we wind down this first quarter of the 2022-23 school year, we wanted to take a moment to let you know what MAOS has been up to, and what students and families have to look forward to in the coming months. So, here we go!

We have been excited to start our second full year of post-pandemic, in-person learning (that's a mouthful) and we continue to move closer toward normalcy in the program. To that end, we were thrilled to get off campus and engage in learning and bonding activities for MAOS students and staff. This quarter MAOS freshmen spent the day at Point Lobos State Preserve, hiking and going on a central coast organism scavenger hunt, which tied nicely into their 9th grade biology curriculum. Sophomores went to Garland Ranch Regional Park in Carmel Valley, where they worked with former MAOS student/current hydrologist Cory Steinmetz to learn about how to measure stream flow and how it affects water supply. Students also participated in a water quality testing activity with MAOS teachers Jason Nicholson and Susan Castello, which tied into their work in Chemistry. Juniors visited Cal Poly, SLO for an admissions presentation and campus tour, and seniors went to Santa Clara University for a tour of the campus and the new STEM center. As the year unfolds, we look forward to further investigating our local scientific and educational communities.

As a MAOS team, we have met consistently over this first quarter to discuss the program, to address student needs, and to plan for the coming months. A few major items to look forward to as we head into fall quarter are the completion of senior internships, more experiential learning opportunities and college visits for our students, and our annual recruitment events for the next school year. MAOS staff and upperclassmen will be attending the International School of Monterey's high school information night, as well as visiting other local middle schools to spread the news about MAOS.

One thing in particular we would like to highlight is the impending return of the MAOS Gala! For those of you unfamiliar with this event – which, due to the pandemic is likely most of you – the Gala is our premier annual fundraising event, organized by the Friends of MAOS Board (thank you, board members!) and MAOS staff. This year's Gala will be held on Friday, March 10, 2023, and is shaping up to be an exciting evening, including a silent auction, a gourmet dinner, dancing, and an all-around fantastic opportunity to interact with members of the MAOS team and members of our community. We are having our first gala planning meeting on October 11th from 5:30-6:30pm in Room 71 at MHS. All are welcome!

And, speaking of fundraising, we are excited to share that MAOS has recently been accepted into the **Monterey County Gives Campaign**, which offers a match for all donations MAOS receives.
